#### Professor Mere Berryman - Director of Poutama Pounamu - University of Waikato

Mere challenges the pervasive and historical discourses that perpetuate educational disparities for Māori students and disrupt these through school leadership and reform initiatives. In here research, she combines understandings from kaupapa Māori and critical theories and has published widely in this field. In 2016, she was a recipient of the New Zealand Honour, Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit for services to education and to Māori in education.

Professor James Chapman - Massey University
