- Theme: **Te Whare Tapa Whā - Hauora For All.**



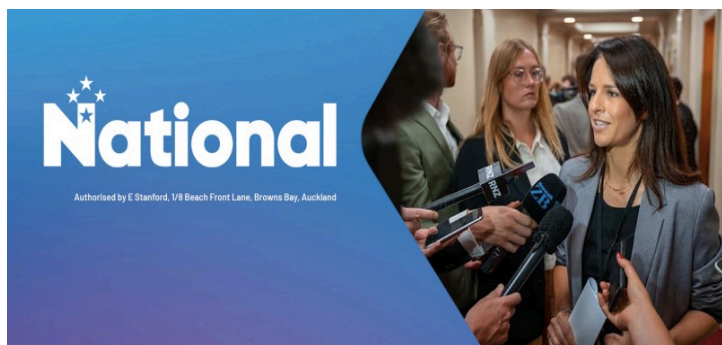

National Centre for Educational Leadership 2024

NZASA has accepted an invitation to partner in a Sector Steering Group to establish priorities for the developing kaupapa of the National Centre for Educational Leadership and to set up a powerful leadership curriculum and resource it with professional learning and development. Specifically, the group will:

- provide educational advice and oversight that builds rigour in the establishment of the Centre's leadership curriculum
- assist in developing a coherent evidence-base for leadership that is bespoke to an Aotearoa New Zealand context
- provide ongoing review of the work of the Centre to ensure it meaningfully contributes to the needs of school leaders

Principal Development Map Work 2023

Alongside a wide range of associations and organisations, I have been contributing as an Advisory Group member to the work being overseen by Tim White for the Ministry of Education. Tim is the Chief Advisor for the Leadership Advisory Programme and he and his team have been developing a ***Principal Development Map***

framework. Linked [HERE](#) is the most up-to-date version of the framework with the changes made as they were tested with the advisory group members. At the end of this document in the final 2 pages, are two examples that illustrate further functionality that Tim and his team think would be useful.

Development scholarships of up to \$5,000 per person available for women in Education

To help encourage more women to step into leadership across the Education Sector, WLNZ is offering scholarships for four leadership development courses. Expressions of Interest are being sourced via this [LINK](#) - note the closing date is Friday 14th December 2023.

The programmes are designed for junior through to executive leaders and scholarships are available across four key levels.

1. Women outside of formal leadership positions can apply for a partial scholarship of \$1,000 for the Impact Programme
2. Early career managers can apply for a partial scholarship of \$1,000 towards the Leading Edge Programme
3. Mid-level leaders can apply for a partial scholarship of \$3,000 towards the Executive Ready Programme
4. Senior and executive leaders can apply for a partial scholarship of \$5,000 towards the Advanced Leadership Programme
